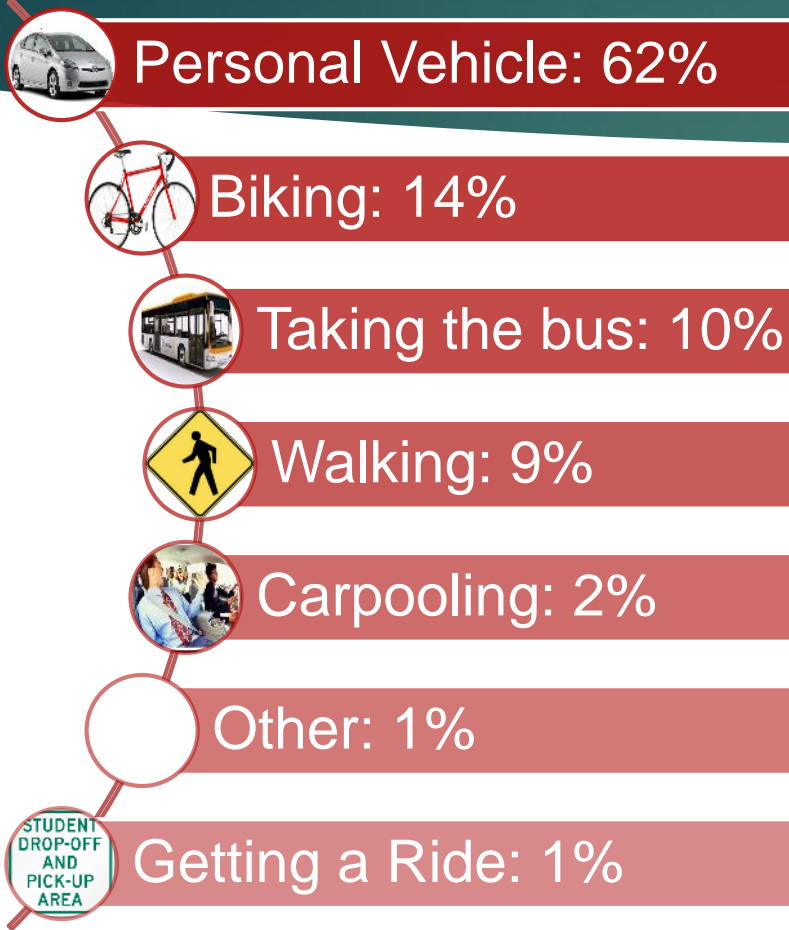
The Evolving Campus

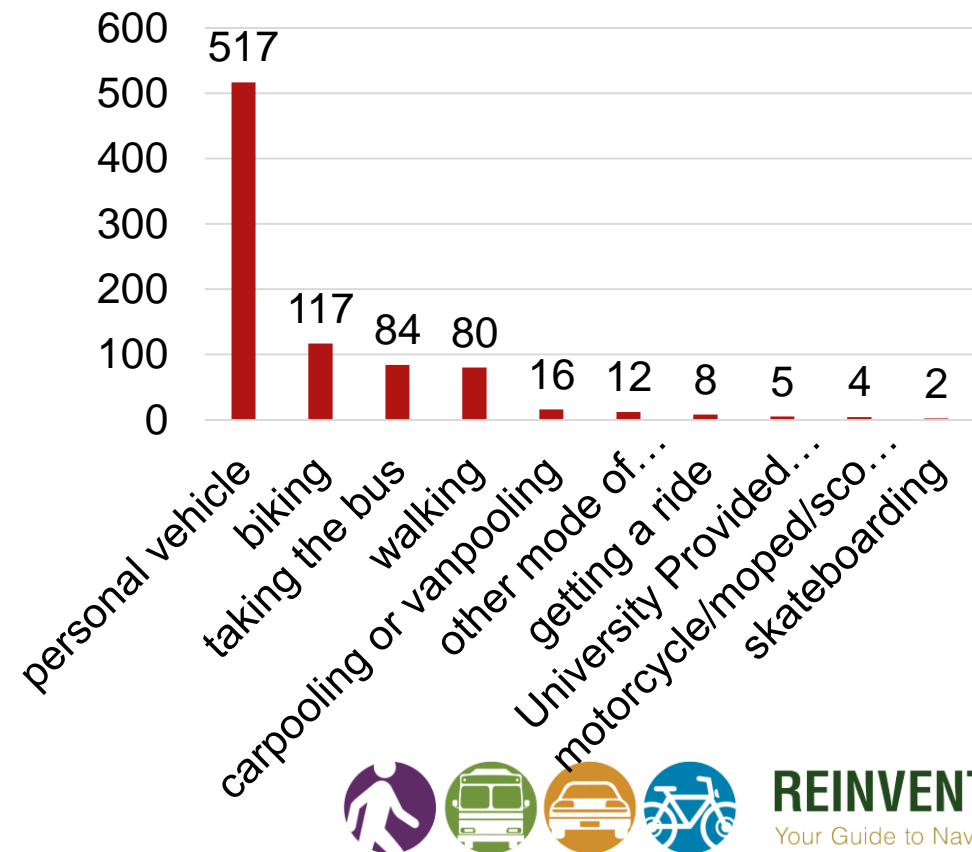

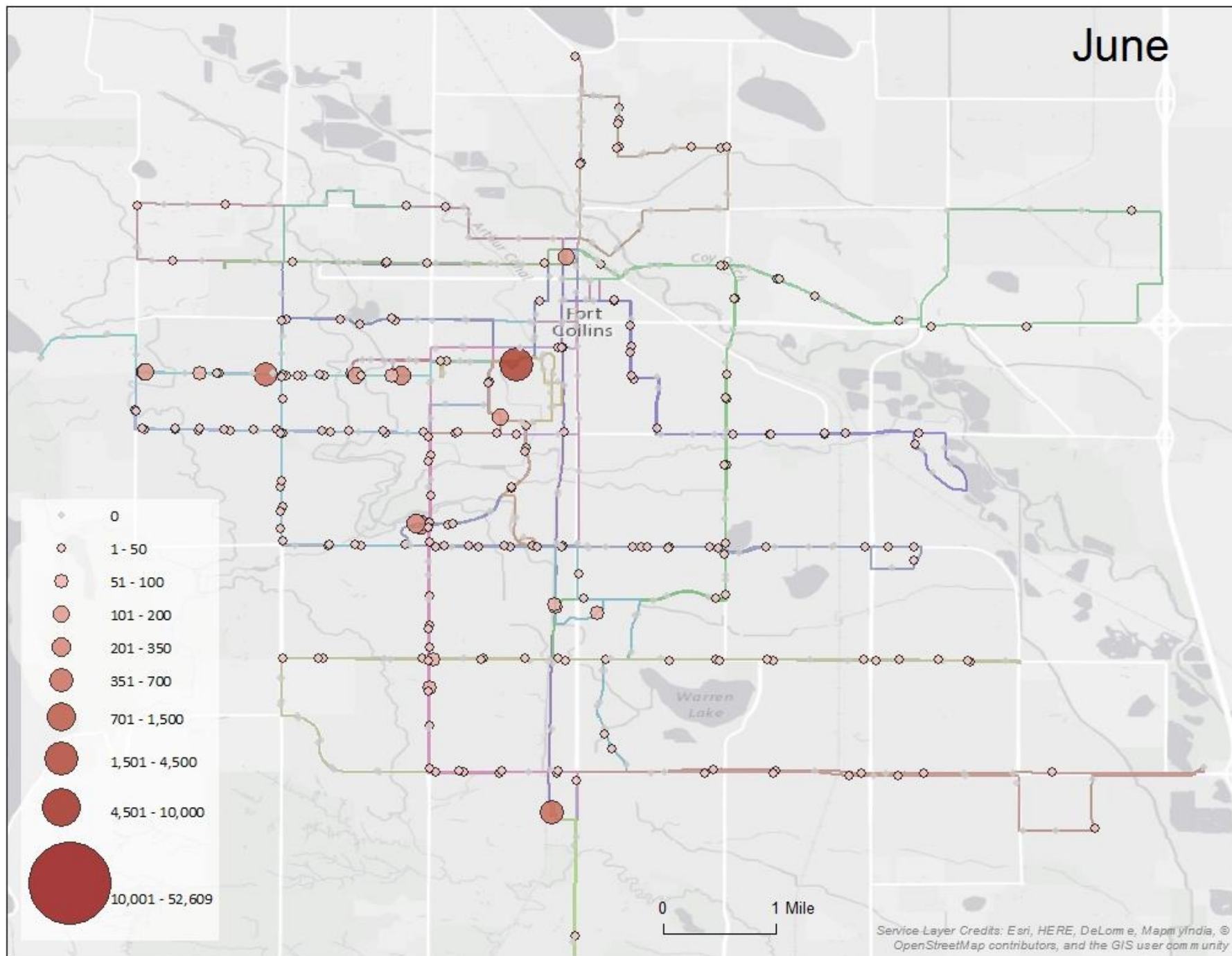
Investing Together

University encourages employees to get back on the bike


Colorado State University's **transportation department** is encouraging more employees to use alternate forms of transportation on their commute thanks to the Get Back on the Bike grant awarded to the school last year.




The grant provided CSU with \$20,000 to create a curriculum for two groups of 20 employees per year over the age of 50, according to Aaron Fodge, CSU's parking and transportation manager. Participants received a helmet, a bike lock, a bike light, a bike bag and one round of bike maintenance.

Fodge said 13 employees committed to being a part of the program after 25 were invited.


Participants are encouraged to ride their bikes three times a week March through November, and once a week on average during December, January and February, said. They may also ride their bike to a bus stop and take the bus the rest of
