

Executive Summary


2016 was a big year for Zero Waste at UCCS. In addition to leading education and communication efforts of the recycling program on campus, our Zero Waste Team pioneered some new projects to help reduce waste in our community.

Some notable intiatives that our team has recently brought to UCCS include an Ozzi reusable container program to cut down on takeout boxes, additional composting stations in the University Center, 3 new ZeroHero tents for promoting Zero Waste events, and 50 new Keep America Beautiful recycling bins placed across campus. These measures help postively impact our diversion rate, engage and educate students on our waste stream, and provide better alternatives to wasteful practices.

In the year ahead, our Zero Waste team is excited to seek new and innovative ways to bring sustainable change to UCCS, and improve the lives of everyone who shares our beautiful campus community.




Diversion Rates



UCCS diverted 42% of our waste steam from the landfill in the past year

This is a 3.7% increase compared to 2015, exceeding our campus-wide goal of 40%



Zero Waste Events
